Below is schedule of impacts to the Brooke Pioneer Trail between Wellsburg and Beech Bottom due to the construction of the Wellsburg Bridge. Construction is tentatively set to begin in June or July of this year. The bridge itself is to be built at Wellsburg Landing just south of Buffalo Creek. When completed, the bridge structure will be barged to the piers and lifted into place. WELLSBURG BRIDGE P3 PROJECT

SCHEDULE IMPACTS TO THE BROOKE PIONEER TRAIL (Trail closures between Wellsburg and Beech Bottom)

- No Impact for 2018 Memorial Day.
- Contractor will start using the trail for access in August/September 2018.
- Trail closes the September/October 2018 for wall installation.
- Trail reopens for 2019 Memorial Day.
- Trail will close again after 2019 Memorial Day for remainder of the wall installation.
- Trail opens again in September 2019.
- Will need daily closures to set bridge girders June 2020, but no complete trail closure

BROOKE-HANCOCK-JEFFERSON BROWNFIELD COALITION

BDC, BHJ, AND THE JEFFERSON COUNTY PORT AUTHORITY (JCPA),

- The Coalition identified twelve (12) Hazardous Waste Sites (totaling 132.76 acres) to US
- Phase I ESA reports completed on eight (8) sites (a total of 63.28 acres assessed).
- Phase II ESA reports on four of these sites completed (36.52 acres assessed)
- One site approved for Phase II ESA (Wellsburg GenPak Building) is on hold; the building is unsafe to enter due to a fire
